

WELLINGBOROUGH. Petty Sessions, Jan 14th.1856

Before T. Wilkins, Esq chairman, Major Hill, C. Sergeant, and J. Young, Esqrs

Felony Robert Hawkes, of Northampton (late of Finedon) and John Hancock, of Northampton, were charged with i breaking into the warehouse of Mr Claypole, of Finedon, and stealing therefrom 17 pairs of water-tight boots, six pairs of unmade ditto, a quantity of Oxonian tops, nine pairs of boot legs, and a quantity of leather, the stolen property being valued at £14. The robbery was committed on the last night of the year or early the following morning, and the goods belonged to Mr Shelton, boot and shoe manufacturer, of Higham Ferrers. The prisoners were further charged with stealing two tame ferrets, belonging to Joseph Humphrey, of the same place, Remanded until Saturday next, when the case will be heard at Higham Ferrers. Receiving Stolen Goods.—James Katterns and John Fisher, both shoemakers of Northampton, were charged with receiving and buying the stolen leather, and were likewise remanded until Saturday.
